An Act to Protect Volunteers from Liability.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

14	2. Immunity. A director, officer or volunteer is immune from civil liability for personal injury, death or property damage, including any monetary loss:

18	A. When the cause of action sounds in negligence and arises from an act or omission by the director, officer or volunteer which occurs within the course and scope of the
20	activities of the charitable organization in which the director, officer or volunteer serves; er

24	B. Arising from any act or omission, not personal to the director, officer or volunteer, which occurs within the course and scope of the activities of the charitable
26	organization in which the director, officer or volunteer serves. ; or

42	This bill ensures that the individuals helping youth sports

programs sponsored by charitable organizations will not be held liable for injuries unless the individuals are reckless. Similar

provisions are found in Rhode Island law.
