An Act to Amend the Composition of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Technical College System.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §12705, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1989, c.
Ł	502, Pt. A, §62 and c. 700, Pt. A, §67, is further amended to read:
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	 Membership. The board of trustees shallconsist consists of 9 <u>12</u> appointed voting members and2-exefficier veting-members with 2 members chosen from each geographic region
	of the State represented by the technical colleges as follows:
	A. One from the State Board of Education;
	B. One from the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System;
	C. Seven <u>Two</u> from the field of business and industry, <u>2</u> from the field of labor, the field of education and one from the general public;
	D The Commissioner of Education on the commissioneric
	D The - Commissioner -efEducation,or the -commissioner's successor,-who-shall-serve-ex-officio;
	EThe-Gommissionerof-Economicand-Community-Development, or-the-commissioner-'s-successor,-who-shall-serve-ex-officio;

	<u>G. Three administrators from the field of post-secondary vocational-technical education; and</u>

	695, §11, is amended to read:
	2. Appointment; terms. Members of the board of trustees shall-be are appointed by the Governor to 4-year terms of office,
	subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education <u>matters</u> and to
	confirmation by the Legislature. No classified or unclassified employee of the State or person who holds elected state office
	may serve on the board of trustees,-with-the-exception-of-the-ex officio-members.
	Sec. 3. Reorganization deadline. The reorganization of the membership of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Technical
	College System as authorized by section 1 of this Act must take place within 90 days of the effective date of this Act. Members

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who are not eligible to serve as a result of the changes made in this Act shall serve until new members have been appointed.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill revises the composition of the Board of Trustees of the Technical College System by removing the ex officio members, providing for a specific number of representatives from administration, faculty, business, labor and the public, and requiring regional representation among the members.
