Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows.

- 5. Medical examination. Upon the request of the petitioner, the commission shall order the employee to submit to examination by an impartial physician or surgeon designated by the commission from the geographical area where the employee resides. The physician or surgeon may not have any prior knowledge of the case or have examined the employee at an earlier time in connection with the case. The fee for the examination shall must be paid by the employer. Payment of compensation may be decreased or suspended by the commissioner pending final decision on the petition if:
- A. The physician or surgeon certifies to the commission after examination that in his the physician's or surgeon's opinion the employee is able to resume work; or
 - B. The employee refuses to submit to an examination.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill ensures that a medical evaluation in a worker's compensation case is performed by a physician or surgeon who has no prior knowledge of the case or involvement with any of the parties in the case.
