IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, to Study Public Access to Maine Lands.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the land and natural resources of the State, including its forests, shorelands, mountains and wetlands, are resources of unparalleled value and significance; and

Whereas, public access to, and reasonable use of, these resources should be, to the extent permissible, the privilege of 10 every citizen of Maine; and

Whereas, the increasing private ownership of land may serve to limit the ability of the citizens of this State to enjoy the 14 educational and recreational benefits offered by the State's land 16 and resources; and

Whereas, the study proposed by this resolve must be completed in time for a report to be submitted to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature and, therefore, it is 20 essential that this study be initiated as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 26 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Public Access to Maine Lands is established; and be it 30 further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 13 members: 34

Three members of the House of Representatives who serve 36 1. on either the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources or the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and 38 Wildlife, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 40 Representatives;

Two Senators who serve on either the Joint Standing 42 2. Committee on Energy and Natural Resources or the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife, to be appointed by the 44 President of the Senate; and

Eight members of the public who have an interest in 3. ensuring public access to the State's land and natural resources 48 and who are capable of assuming the public trust. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives 50 shall each appoint 4 of these public members; and be it further 52

Sec. Appointments: meetings. 3. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 2 effective date of this resolve. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives jointly shall appoint 4 the chair of the commission from among its members. When the appointment of all of the members of the commission is completed, 6 the chair of the commission shall call the first meeting no later · 8 than August 15, 1991; and be it further

 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall evaluate methods to encourage reasonable public access to land in this
State. In conducting this study, the commission shall:

1. Study the benefits and advantages afforded by public access to publicly owned land and privately owned land;

2. Develop means of educating the public on the importance 18 of free and public access to land and resources;

20 3. Study and evaluate financial incentives, including tax incentives, designed to encourage public access to land; and

Recommend measures to promote and encourage such public
access; and be it further

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation,
to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by November 1, 1991; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may contract with a consultant to provide professional services in carrying out these duties. The consultant shall provide clerical assistance to the commission and shall prepare any legislation recommended by the commission. The chair of the study group shall manage the consultant's work; and be it further

38 Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative 40 per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. All 42 members of the commission who are not state employees are entitled to receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised 44 Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; 46 and be it further

48 Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

Provides funds for the expenses of members of the Commission to Study Public Access to Maine Lands who are not state employees, per diem for Legislative members and \$20,000 for contractual services which includes printing costs.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve establishes the Commission to Study Public 28 Access to Maine Lands. The commission will study ways to ensure public access to publicly owned and privately owned land and 30 natural resources in this State.
