STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act Concerning the Establishment of a Coal-fired Plant for Electrical Energy Production.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Special advisory referendum on the establishment of a coal-fired, energy producing plant with the capacity of burning 1,500 tons of coal per day. The Secretary of State shall, at a special statewide election on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act, hold a special advisory referendum to determine the sentiment of the people on the establishment of a coal-fired, energy producing plant with the capacity of burning 1,500 tons of coal per day.

Sec. 2. Advisory referendum procedure; submission at special statewide election. This advisory referendum shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at a special statewide election to be held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to give their opinion on this question by voting on the following:

"Do you favor the establishment in this State of a 24 coal-fired, energy producing plant with the capacity of burning 1,500 tons of coal per day?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall 28 vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, 30 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation 32 meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor 34 shall review the returns and shall proclaim, without delay, the total number of ballots in favor of and opposed to the 36 establishment of a coal-fired, energy producing plant with the capacity of burning 1,500 tons of coal per day.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each 42 city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this advisory 44 referendum.

50 This bill directs the Secretary of State to hold a special advisory referendum at the next special statewide election to 52 determine whether the voters of the State favor the establishment of a coal-fired, energy producing plant with the capacity of 54 burning 1,500 tons of coal per day.
