COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "<sup>A</sup>" to H.P. 361, L.D. 515, Bill, "An Act to Expand Consumer Membership on the Board of Osteopathic Examination and Registration"

Amend the bill in the first line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) by inserting at the beginning the following: 'Sec.1.'

Further amend the bill in that part designated "\$2561." in the first paragraph in the 3rd line (page 1, line 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "7" and inserting in its place the following: '7 9'

Further amend the bill in that part designated "\$2561." in the first paragraph in the 5th line (page 1, line 12 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Four" and inserting in its place the following: 'Six'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

and expenses of the new board members.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

30 The original bill replaces one professional member of the  
31 7-member Board of Osteopathic Examination and Registration with a  
32 3rd representative of the public and changes the designation of  
these members to representatives of the interests of consumers.

This amendment adds, rather than replaces, 2 professional  
members, thus bringing the Board membership to 9.

36

This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
