An Act to Amend the Minimum Age for Obtaining a Driver's License.

_	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §538, first ¶, as amended by PL 1989, c. 513,
4	§3, is further amended to read:
6	No <u>An</u> operator's license may <u>not</u> be issued to any <u>a</u> person under <del>1</del> 6- <del>years <u>15 years and 6 months</u> of age, except a special</del>
8	restricted license as provided in section 538-A.
10	Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §585, as amended by PL 1983, c. 455, §22, is repealed.

.*	The Secretary of State may not accept the application of a
18	<u>minor for an operator's license or instruction permit unless the</u> following requirements are met.

22	1. Authorization. The applicant must have authorization to apply as follows:
24	A. The application is signed by a parent or guardian having the custody of the minor or by the spouse of the minor,
26	provided that the spouse is of the age of 18 years or over;
28	<u>B. In the event a minor has no father, mother, guardian or spouse who has attained the age of 18 years, the application</u>
30	is signed by the employer of the minor, provided that the
32	<u>employer has attained the age of 18 years; or</u>
34	<u>C. The minor is emancipated pursuant to Title 15, section</u> 3506-A, and the application is accompanied by an attested
36	copy of the court order of emancipation.
	2. Student. The applicant must be an honor roll student
38	enrolled in a secondary school and the application must be

42	A. A statement signed by the student's guidance counselor attesting that the applicant is capable of being a

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill lowers the age limit for operator licenses from 16 years to 15 years and 6 months of age. The bill also provides 6 that an applicant for a license who is a student under 18 years of age must be on the school honor roll for the grading period 8 prior to the application. The student's application must be 10 accompanied by a certificate from the applicant's school certifying the student's honor roll average and must also be accompanied by a statement signed by the school guidance 12 counselor that the applicant is capable of being a responsible 14 driver. The bill retains the additional requirements found in current law regarding parental or other authorization and driver 16 education.

2
