16 Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act Concerning Reinbursement for Certain Medical Services as
Special Education Services'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause before the statement of fact:

'State special education services; study. The Department of Education shall conduct a staff study regarding the costs, 26 benefits and possible alternative ways of amending existing state 28 special education services rules to provide coverage for necessary medical services when identified as educationally 30 appropriate. The department shall hold one or more public forums to hear testimony or to present findings and recommendations to interested parties. The department shall evaluate the results of 32 the staff study and public input and present a report of its findings and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on 34 Education no later than January 15, 1992. In developing findings 36 and recommendations, the department shall take into account the historical distinction in state and federal law between educational and medical services, the current state and federal 38 restrictions governing reimbursement for medical services, the 40 evolution of state rules that permit reimbursement for some medically related services and the possibility that certain 42 services traditionally defined as medical because of the source of the treatment may be educationally necessary to enable some 44 students to benefit from an appropriate education.

FISCAL NOTE

The costs associated with a study of the cost, feasibility 6 and means of including certain medical services as reimbursable special education costs can be absorbed within current budgeted 8 resources of the Department of Education.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill established behavioral optometry services as an allowable special education cost to be reimbursed by the State. This amendment replaces the original bill and directs the Department of Education to conduct a study of the cost, feasibility and means of including certain medical services as reimbursable special education costs when necessary to provide an appropriate education to some students. The department will report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education by January 15, 1992.
