IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Expand the Availability of Automatic Liens to Certain Businesses.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §3951, as amended by PL 1987, c. 63, §1, is
4	repealed and the following enacted in its place:
б	<u>§3951. Automatic lien</u>
8	1. Lien established. A person, partnership or corporation engaged in one or more of the following activities has a lien on
10	the item that the activity involves for a reasonable compensation for any labor or materials expended on that item:
12	A. Making, altering, repairing or cleaning any watch,
14	clock, jewelry, electric motor, major and traffic appliance, small motor not to exceed 20 horsepower, radio, electronic
16	equipment, musical instrument, furniture, photograph, artwork, sports equipment and photography equipment; and

20	B. Cleaning, repairing or pressing clothes.
22	2. Lien priority. A lien under this section takes precedence over all other claims and incumbrances.
24	3. Exemption from attachment. The item that is subject to a lien under this section is exempt from attachment or execution
26	until the lien and the cost of enforcing it are satisfied.
