12	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 420, L.D. 603, Bill, "An
14	Act to Amend the Laws Concerning Smoking in Restaurants"
16	Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 by striking out all of paragraph A and inserting in its place the following:
18	'A. Smoking tobacco or any other substance in a restaurant
20	is prohibited.'
22	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:
24	'Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1579-A, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1989, c.
26	451, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
28	3. Violations. A person who smokes in a restaurant, a restaurant operator who allows smoking in that operator's
30	restaurant or a restaurant operator who fails to post no smoking signs commits a civil violation for which a warning may be issued
32	for the first violation and a forfeiture of \$50 may be adjudged for each subsequent violation.

36	Further amend the bill at the end before the statement of fact by inserting the following:
38	'FISCAL NOTE
40	This bill prohibits smoking in restaurants, provides that a warning be issued for the first offense and reduces the fine for
42	violations. The additional work load and administrative costs associated with a minimal number of additional cases filed in
44	District Court as a result of the violation will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. There
46	within the budgeted resources of the sudfill bepartment. There will also be a decrease in General Fund revenue from the imposition of a lesser fine for violations of smoking
48	prohibitions. This amount can not be estimated at this time.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 The original bill forbids persons to smoke in restaurants and requires restaurant operators to post no smoking signs. The 6 penalty currently in law of a forfeiture of \$100 to \$500 is retained.

This amendment changes the wording of the smoking prohibition to allow both smokers and restaurant operators to be liable for a violation of the prohibition. It changes the punishment for a violation to a warning for the 1st offense and a \$50 forfeiture for subsequent offenses.
