An Act to Provide Administrative Oversight of Organic Food Certification in Maine.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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4	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §556, as amended by PL 1989, c. 663, is further amended to read:

8	No \underline{A} food which \underline{that} is labeled or advertised as natural, organic, organically grown, biologically grown or by a similar
10	term, may <u>not</u> be labeled or advertised as "certified" unless the name of the person or organization which <u>that</u> provides that
12	certification is stated on the label or in the advertisement. Any organization within this State that provides certification of
14	food may not make membership a condition of certification under this section. Organizations offering certification services in
16	the State shall provide information on standards used to the department on an annual basis.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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There is increasing consumer interest in the availability of organic foods. This bill allows the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to receive information from private certifying groups in the State. In addition, the department is authorized to enact rules and conduct investigations to enforce current law.
