**An Act to Facilitate Policies and Procedures of the Driver Education
Evaluation Program.**

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 22 MRSA §7202, as affected by PL 1989, c. 790, §5, is
amended to read:

6 **§7202. Division of Driver Education Evaluation**

8 The Division of Driver Education Evaluation shall administer
10 the alcohol and other drug education, evaluation and treatment
12 program. The division shall, within 80 days after notification
of the suspension of an operator's license, certify to the
Secretary of State:

14 1. **Administration of Driver Education Evaluation Program.**
Those individuals who have satisfactorily completed the program
16 prescribed by section 7203; and

18 2. **Administration of Nondriver Education Evaluation
Program.** Those individuals who have satisfactorily completed the
20 requirements of this chapter by satisfying the requirement for
22 completion of treatment as defined in section 7201 by means
other than the program prescribed by section 7203.; and

24 3. **Administration of incomplete evaluation program.** Those
26 individuals who have not satisfactorily completed the program
prescribed by section 7203 and include written documentation of
the requirements to be completed by those individuals.

30 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

32 This bill requires the Department of Human Services,
34 Division of Driver Education Evaluation, to submit to the
Secretary of State within 80 days after the suspension of an
36 individual's operator's license certification of any individual
who has or has not satisfactorily completed the alcohol and other
38 drug education, evaluation and treatment program. Individuals
are currently experiencing delays in having their licenses
40 reinstated due to the uncertainty of individual counselor's
criteria for completion of the program. The bill ensures that
42 the Driver Education Evaluation Program is completed within 80
days, which enables the individual to have the operator's license
reinstated within 90 days.
