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	This amendment deletes the proposed changes to the
6	harassment laws and the civil rights laws. It amends the crime reporting laws to state specifically the types of characteristics
8	that are the apparent motivations for crimes that must be recorded, consistent with federal crime reporting requirements.
10	The language tracks the federal Hate Crime Statistics Act, Public Law 101-275.
12	This amendment adds an effective date of January 1, 1992 to
14	allow the State Bureau of Identification to revise its crime data collection system to accommodate these changes.
