

L.D. 619 2 (Filing No. H-154) 4 6 STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 8 **115TH LEGISLATURE** FIRST REGULAR SESSION 10 12 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "1" to H.P. 436, L.D. 619, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Licensing of Nurses" 14 16 Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§2202." by striking out all of the 2nd sentence (page 1, lines 11 to 15 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 18 'Upon successfully passing such the examination, the board shall issue 20 to the applicant a license to practice professional nursing as a registered nurse, the license to be in force for a period of at 22 least one year until the birth date of the licensee.' 24 Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§2206." by striking out all of the first paragraph (page 1, 26 lines 23 to 38 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 'The license of every registered nurse licensed under this 28 chapter shall-be-renewed-annually is renewable every 2 years, 30 except as otherwise provided. At least 30 days before the anniversary-of-that-person's-birth date that the license expires, 32 the board shall mail an application for renewal of license to each professional nurse who holds a valid license,-which. The 34 application shall must be mailed to the most recent address of that person as it appears on the records of the board. That 36 person shall complete the renewal application and return it to the board with a the renewal fee of-\$20 as the board designates 38 but not to exceed \$100 before the anniversary-of--that-person's birth expiration date of the license. Upon receipt of the 40 application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to the applicant a certificate of renewal of license for the-year a period of 2 years, expiring on the 42 anniversary of the applicant's birth.' 44

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 436, L.D. 619

Further amend the bill in section 3 in that part designated "§2252." by striking out all of the 3rd sentence (page 2, lines 15 to 20 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 'Upon successfully passing such the examination, the board shall issue to the applicant a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse, that license to be in force from-the-date-of issue for a period of at least one year until the birth date of the licensee.'

Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "§2255." by striking out all of the first paragraph (page 2, lines 28 to 43 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'The license of every practical nurse licensed under this 14 chapter shall--be-renewed--annually is renewable every 2 years, 16 except as otherwise provided. At least 30 days before the anniversary-of-that-person's birth date that the license expires, 18 the board shall mail an application for renewal of license to each practical nurse who holds a valid license, which, The 20 application shall must be mailed to the most recent address of the that person as it appears on the records of the board. That 22 person shall complete the renewal application and return it to the board with a the renewal fee of-\$20 as the board designates 24 but not to exceed \$100 before the anniversary-of--that-person's bisth expiration date of the license. Upon receipt of the application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the 26 application and issue to the applicant a certificate of renewal 28 of license for the-year a period of 2 years, expiring on the anniversary of the applicant's birth.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 5. Effective date and transition. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1992. The board shall renew 1/2 of the licenses due
for renewal in 1992 for one year and the remaining for 2 years. The board shall determine the specific licenses to be renewed for
these time periods.

This bill changes the licensing process for registered 50 nurses and practical nurses to provide for a 2-year renewal process. The Department of Professional and Financial 52 Regulation, Board of Nursing will realize some reduction in COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 436, L.D. 619

license processing costs. The collections of 2-year license fees 2 will also create an initial one-time increase of dedicated revenue, estimated to be \$95,600. The amount of the savings that will realized by reducing the time needed to process licenses can 4 not be estimated at this time. 6 The transition provisions for conversion to a 2-year cycle will require computer programming changes, the cost of which can 8 be absorbed within current allocations of the Board of Nursing.' 10 STATEMENT OF FACT 12 This amendment makes the following changes to the bill. 14 16 1. It changes the 3-year renewal period to a 2-year renewal period. 18 2. It removes the specific license fee and replaces it with 20 a fee limit of \$100 per renewal. 22 3. It retains language currently in law that designates the anniversary of a person's birth as the expiration date of the 24 license. 26 4. It provides an effective date of 1992 and provides that the renewal period for 1/2 of the licenses in that year are to be 28 for one year.
