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## FISCAL NOTE

This bill ensures that, to the extent that funds are available within the Office of Substance Abuse for this purpose, regional alcohol councils are to be funded in a manner that recognizes local difference in cost and travel distances and allows equal provision of services in each geographic area.

The Office of Substance Abuse will provide funding to the regional alcohol councils considering these factors and within the amount of its budgeted resources. The amount of funds available for this purpose could be affected by final enactment of the current services budget. The Governor's adjusted proposal reduces the amount of funds available to the Office of Substance Abuse for its programs and for funding of regional alcohol councils.'

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment removes the requirement that the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse ensure funding to the Maine affiliate of the National Council on Alcoholism and modifies the requirement to fund the regional alcohol councils by adding the provision that the councils will be funded to the extent that funds are available.
