(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and Whereas, tipping fees and other solid waste costs are б increasing; and 8 Whereas, municipal revenue-sharing funds are decreasing; and Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 10 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 12 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 14 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 38 MRSA §2201, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 585, Pt. A, 18 §7, is repealed and the following enacted in its place: 100 for the second 20 The portion of the money in the fund not needed to meet the current obligations of the agency must be distributed annually 22 among the municipalities and credited toward partial payment of municipal solid waste management costs. The joint standing 24 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and 26 natural resource matters shall determine annually, after consulting with the Maine Waste Management Agency and a representative of municipal government selected jointly by the 28 chairs of that committee, that portion of the money to be distributed among the municipalities. The funds must be 30 distributed to the municipalities based on each municipality's 32 need and an equitable and effective apportionment of revenues between State Government and local government. 34 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 36 38 STATEMENT OF FACT 40

This bill requires that any surplus in the administration account of the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund be returned to the municipalities, based on need and an equitable sharing of revenues between State Government and local government.

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
