HOUSE AMENDMENT "<sup>A</sup>" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 443,  
L.D. 633, Bill, "An Act Relating to Violations Involving the  
Disregard of Red Flashing Lights on School Buses"

Amend the amendment in subsection 2-A in the 4th line (page  
1, line 24 in amendment) by striking out the following:  
"violates this subsection as follows" and inserting in its place  
the following: 'commits a civil violation'

Further amend the amendment in subsection 2-A in paragraph D  
by striking out all of subparagraph (1) and inserting in its  
place the following:

'(1) If a person other than the owner is convicted of  
operating the vehicle at the time of the violation in  
violation of subsection 2, then the registered owner  
may not be found in violation of this subsection.'

Further amend the amendment in subsection 2-A in paragraph D  
in subparagraph (4) in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 31 and 32  
in amendment) by striking out the following: "owner may not be  
found in violation of" and inserting in its place the following:  
'registered owner may not be charged under'

Further amend the amendment in subsection 2-A in paragraph E  
in the last line (page 2, line 35 in amendment) by inserting  
after the underlined word "violation" the following: 'for which  
a forfeiture of not less than \$50 or more than \$250 may be  
adjudged'

6 This amendment clarifies language in the bill and provides  
8 that when an operator is convicted, the registered owner of the  
vehicle may not be found in violation of the Maine Revised  
Statutes, Title 29, section 2019, subsection 2.
