	STATEMENT OF FACT

	This bill protects a person who becomes a suspect of a
28	criminal investigation from premature disclosure to the media of
	the suspect's identity. In the course of a criminal
30	investigation, a law enforcement agency may investigate dozens of
	criminal suspects who are actually innocent of the crime. This
32	bill protects those persons from the potentially harmful release
	of their identities before they are actually arrested or charged

with the crime.

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
