	Effective January 1, 1995, any boat powered by a motor
48	larger than 6 horsepower that is not a rental boat must have at
	least one person on board who has completed a 6-hour course in
50	boating safety and has received a certificate in boating safety.
	A person who operates a boat in violation of this law may be
52	fined up to \$25. The bill requires the Commissioner of Inland

Fisheries and Wildlife to provide the 6-hour training course. A person holding a marine resource license issued by the Commissioner of Marine Resources is exempt from this Act.
