(Beit enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

25 MRSA §2923, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 840, §3, is amended to read:

§2923. Requirements of municipalities

- 1. Public safety answering point. By July 1, 1991, each municipality shall may designate one public safety answering point to serve as the receiving point for all requests for emergency services within that municipality. The Department of Public Safety communication centers shall must serve as public safety answering points for the unorganized territory. If—a municipality—fails—to—designate—a—public—safety—answering—point by—July—1,—1991,—the—department—shall—designate—one—for—the municipality—
- 2. Customer information. Each municipality that designates a public safety answering point shall cooperate with the department and the appropriate telephone utilities to establish a customer data base containing information to identify the location of each telephone number within the municipality.

 Customer information provided under this chapter may be used only for the purposes of responding to emergency calls or for the investigation of false or intentionally misleading reports of incidents requiring emergency services.
