IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Require That School Administrative Units Be Paid the Actual Per Pupil Cost for Students from the Unorganized Territory.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §3253-A, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1985, c. 603, §1, is further amended to read:
- The commissioner shall pay tuition for each 6 Tuition. tuition student in an amount equal to the official tuition rate approved pursuant to seetiens section 5805, 5806, 5809 or 7302 8 for the receiving school for nonresident students enrolled in secondary schools or special education or vocational education 10 programs, provided that the student maintains a satisfactory standard of deportment and scholarship. Notwithstanding the 12 provisions of section 5805, subsection 2, a school administrative unit accepting secondary school students from the unorganized 14 territory must receive the unit's actual per student tuition 16 costs for the preceding year for each student from the unorganized territory. 18

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §5805, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

2. Maximum allowable tuition. The maximum allowable tuition charge by a public secondary school shall-be is the rate computed under subsection 1 or the state average per public secondary student cost as adjusted, whichever is lower, except that school administrative units accepting secondary school students from the unorganized territory must receive the actual per pupil tuition cost for the preceding year.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill permits school administrative units accepting tuitioned secondary school students from the unorganized territory to receive the actual per pupil tuition costs for the preceding year. Under current law, public secondary schools may not receive tuition payment for secondary school students from the unorganized territory in excess of the state average per public secondary student cost as adjusted.
