22	STATEMENT OF FACT

	This bill restores the remedy of double damages for
26	fraudulent transfers. In 1985 the Legislature enacted the Uniform Fraudulent Transfer Act and repealed the provision
28	authorizing damages of up to 2 times the value of the property involved in the fraud. Without the double damages, the creditor
30	pays more when the creditor is defrauded than when the creditor

is not defrauded.
