Resolved: That the commission shall conduct a 24 study relating to the increasingly evident existence of chronic fatigue and immune dysfunction syndrome in Maine. In conducting 26 the study the commission shall: 28 Review the findings and recommendations presented in the 30 April, 1987 report on Chronic Epstein-Barr, Chronic Fatique Syndrome virus infection prepared by the National Institutes of Health of the Department of Health and Human Services; 32 34 Develop means of educating health care professionals throughout the State to help increase awareness of the illness as well as the needs of those who suffer from the illness; 36 38 Create a registry of doctors, knowledgeable about the latest information and treatment of the illness, available for patient referral in the State; and 40 42 Develop plans to accomplish the following long-term
 - A. Establishment of a clinic in the State for treatment of patients with chronic fatigue and immune dysfunction syndrome or referral when necessary. The clinic will:

(1) Report all diagnoses of chronic fatigue and immune 2 dysfunction syndrome to the Department of Services, Bureau of Health for follow-up and referral to the clinic established in section 4 of this resolve and also for forwarding to the Division of Disease Control; 6 8 (2) Refer patients and families to counselors who are familiar with chronic fatigue and immune dysfunction syndrome and chronic illness to aid them in coping with 10 the disease; and 12 (3) Provide information regarding in-home services, such as physicians and visiting nurses, laboratory 14 services, domestic care and tutorial services 16 students who chronic fatique and immune have dysfunction syndrome; 18 Establishment of educational programs to inform and provide current information to patients and their families 20 as well as school officials and to create an awareness of other diseases that imitate chronic fatigue and immune 22 dysfunction syndrome; and 24 Development of guidelines for the providers of health insurance, temporary disability, social security and general 26 public assistance regarding the inclusion of chronic fatigue and immune dysfunction syndrome in their coverage; and be it 28 further .30 Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 32 its report together with any necessary implementing legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature before 34 November 1, 1991; and be it further Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: 36 That the Bureau of Health staff the commission. The commission may additional staff assistance from state agencies represented on 38 the commission; and be it further 40 Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the 42 legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 44 Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission All members of the commission who are not state employees are entitled to receive expenses, as defined in Title 46 5, section 12002, upon application to the Director of the Bureau of Health for those expenses; and be it further 48 Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are 50 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of
