- 2. Payment. The appropriate department may make reasonable payment to affected property owners net-to-exceed-\$100-as-a landmark-location-allewance for the cost of reestablishing the landmark location.

STATEMENT OF FACT

State departments are authorized to pay for the reestablishment of a landmark location destroyed in the process of any public improvement. Since 1973, the maximum for this cost has been set at \$100. This bill replaces the \$100 maximum, which is no longer reasonable, and allows the payment of reasonable cost for this work.
