42	It is currently unknown how many people in the armed forces were issued a moose permit and were subsequently called to serve
44	in an armed conflict. It is expected, however, that this bill will have an insignificant impact on the collection of

This amendment allows a person to carry forward the privilege to hunt with a moose permit to the next appropriate season upon return to the State if that person had previously been issued the permit and had not been able to use the permit because of being called to active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States to serve in an armed conflict. Permits used under this provision do not affect the number of moose permits that may be issued under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7463-A, subsection 4. This amendment also adds a fiscal note.
