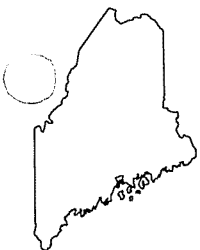

**An Act Regarding Moose and Antlerless Deer Permits for People Who
Have Been Called to Active Duty.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7076, sub-§6-A is enacted to read:

6-A. Persons in armed forces called to active duty. Any person who is issued a moose permit under section 7463-A or a permit under section 7457 to hunt antlerless deer and who is subsequently called to active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States and so is unable to use the permit, is entitled to use the same permit during the next appropriate season following that person's return to the State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows a person to carry forward the privilege to hunt with an antlerless deer permit or moose permit to the next appropriate season upon return to the State if that person had previously been issued the permit and had not been able to use the permit because of being called to active service in the armed forces.
