IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act Regarding Continuing Education for Administrators of Boarding Homes.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	22 MRSA §7914 is enacted to read:
4	§7914. Continuing education for administrators of boarding homes
6	1. Training required. Boarding home administrators shall
8	obtain at least 12 hours per year of training that is relevant to the operation of a boarding home. The training may be provided
10	by a state agency or by a trainer determined to be qualified by the department.

14	2. Reimbursement of costs. The department shall reimburse boarding homes for the training costs of a boarding home administrator under this section. The department shall pay the
16	<u>percentage of training costs that is equal to the percentage of</u> <u>residents of the boarding home who receive state assistance.</u>
18	This reimbursement is in addition to the boarding home's routine service cost limitation and administrative allowance. By
20	December 1, 1991, the department shall adopt rules that govern reimbursement under this section. The rules must cover at least
22	the following:
24	A. The extent to which travel costs are reimbursable;
26	B. The maximum reimbursable cost per training hour; and
28	C. Whether the cost of substitute staffing is reimbursable.
30	3. Training as a condition of licensing. Beginning January 1, 1992, the training required in this section is a condition of
32	licensure for boarding homes of more than 6 residents. Beginning January 1, 1994, the training required in this section is a
34	condition of licensure of all boarding homes.

38	STATEMENT OF FACT
40	This bill requires administrators of boarding homes to obtain 12 hours of relevant training each year. It makes the
42	training a condition of licensure as of January 1, 1992 for boarding homes with more than 6 residents and as of January 1,
44	1994 for all boarding homes. The Department of Human Services is
46	required to reimburse a percentage of the training costs.
