IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Amend the Charter of the Bangor Water District.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

## P&SL 1957, c. 39, §15 is enacted to read:

Sec. 15. Referenda on district decisions. Upon petition of at least 10% of the voters in the City of Bangor voting in the last 6 qubernatorial election, decision of the district must be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Bangor at a regular 8 election or a special election called and held for that purpose. 10 The petition to submit a district decision to the voters must be submitted within 90 days of the district's decision. A special election must be called, advertised and conducted according to 12 the law relating to municipal elections, except that the board of 14 registration is not required to prepare for posting, nor the city clerk to post, a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of voters, the board of voter registration shall be 16 in session the secular day next preceding the special election. 18 The city clerk shall prepare the required ballots, on which the clerk shall reduce the subject matter of the decision to a single 20 question.

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the decision.

The decision takes effect immediately upon acceptance by a 26 majority of the legal voters voting at the election, provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the 28 acceptance of this Act equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all candidates for Governor cast in the district at the last 30 gubernatorial election.

The result of the vote must be declared by the municipal officers of the City of Bangor and due certificate of the vote must be filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the charter of the Bangor Water District by adding a referendum clause that states if 10% of the district's voters sign a petition, the decision of the water district may be put to referendum. The bill also requires the petition to be submitted within 90 days of the district's decision.
