STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Provide Equitable Representation on the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System.

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	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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4	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17102, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B, §33, is further amended to read:
6	1. Composition. The Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System; established by section 12004-F, subsection 9,
8	shall-be is composed of 8 10 trustees, as follows:
10	A. The Treasurer of State of the Deputy Treasurer of State, ex officio, as a nonvoting trustee;
12	B. A person who is a member of the retirement system
14	through employment as a teacher and who is duly elected by the Maine Teachers' Association;
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22	D. Four persons appointed by the Governor and subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over aging, veterans and retirement and

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17102, sub-§§2, 4 and 5, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, are amended to read:

Chair. The board shall elect from its membership a
 8 ehairman chair.

4. Oath. Each trustee shall, within 10 days after his appointment or election, take an oath of office to faithfully
 discharge the duties of a trustee, in the form prescribed by the Constitution of Maine.

A. The oath shall <u>must</u> be subscribed to by the trustee making it.

B. The oath shall <u>must</u> be certified by the officer before whom it was taken and immediately filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

5. Transaction of business. The transaction of business by the board shall-be is governed as follows.

A. Feur <u>Six</u> trustees shall-constitute <u>constitute</u> a quorum for the transaction of any business.

B. Each voting trustee is entitled to one vote.

C. Feur <u>Six</u> votes are necessary for any resolution or action by the board at any meeting of the board.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

36 This bill adds 2 members to the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System one who is a member of the 38 retirement system through employment as a participating local district employee and who is appointed by the AFL-CIO, and one 40 member of the retirement system appointed by the Maine School Management Association. The bill also increases the number of 42 members needed for a quorum from 4 to 6 and the minimum number of votes needed to take action from 4 to 6. The bill also make some 44 technical corrections to the law.
