Resolve, to Establish the Commission on Electric Utilities and Long-range Energy Production Planning.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the State is faced with immediate and growing energy needs; and

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Whereas, this resolve establishes a state commission to study electric utilities and long-range energy production planning; and

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Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study can be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

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Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission on Electric Utilities and Long-range Energy Production Planning is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 15 members: three Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom must be a member of the minority party; 3 members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom must be a member of the minority party; the Director of the Planning Office: the Chair of the Public Utilities Commission; the Public Advocate; the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development; and the Commissioner of Environmental Protection. Additional members, appointed jointly President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House Representatives, must include one member representing environmental organization, one member representing a utility company, one member representing a nonutility electric generator and one member representing a nongenerator business interest. The members of the commission shall elect a chair, who must be a legislative member; and be it further

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Appointments: meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of commission; and be it further

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	Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall develop a
2	long-range plan for the production of electricity within the State. The plan must include:
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	1. An assessment of the future demand for energy in the
6	State under a variety of scenarios regarding energy prices and anticipated conservation and cogeneration measures;
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	2. A study of the various options available to the State to
1,0	meet growing energy needs, including, but not limited to, conservation, cogeneration, small power production, purchases
12	from Canada and utility-sponsored generation. This study should examine for each option its predicted price, reliability and
14	environmental impact within the State;
16	 An analysis of the State's energy situation in the context of regional power arrangements and agreements;
18	4. An examination of the existing transmission capacities
20	within this State and the rest of New England, including availability, pricing, accessibility and reliability. This
22	examination should identify transmission bottlenecks and suggest strategies and policies to address them; and
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	5. Recommendations to the Governor and to the Legislature

28	Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the State Planning Office shall staff the commission. The commission may request
30	additional staff assistance from state agencies represented on
