An Act Concerning School Psychological Service Providers.



#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3812, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1967, c. 544, §82, is amended to read:

is specifically prohibited that individual Ιt any individuals or erganization organizations shall present himself be presented to the public by any or incorporating the name "psychological," "psychologist" "psychology," other than those so licensed by this chapter, except that any psychological seientist scientists employed by a recognized research laboratory, college, university or state or federal agency may represent himself themselves by the title conferred upon him them by the administration of such or equivalent laboratory, college, university or state or federal Nothing in this section shall may be construed as permitting such persons to offer their service to any other persons or organizations as consultants or to accept remuneration any psychological services other than that of their institutional salaries unless they have been licensed under this Visiting lecturers from recognized laboratories, colleges or universities are exempt from this section and may utilize their academic research title when presenting lectures to similar institutions or organizations. School psychological service providers who are certified by the Department of Education may represent themselves by the titles conferred upon them by the Department of Education in accordance with section 3841. Students of psychology, psychological interns and other persons preparing for the profession of psychological examiner or psychologist under qualified supervision in recognized training institutions or facilities may be designated by such titles as intern"," "psychological "psychological trainee" or clearly indicating such training status.

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Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3840, as amended by PL 1989, c. 700, Pt. A, §148, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

### §3840. Joint Committee on Certification for School Psychological Service Providers

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1. Joint committee established. There is established a Joint Committee on Certification for School Psychological Service Providers.

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2. Purpose. The purpose of the Joint Committee on Certification for School Psychological Service Providers is to recommend policies and procedures that will assist local school systems in providing accessible, high quality psychological services to meet the needs of Maine school children.

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3. Membership. The joint committee consists of 6 members.

- 4 <u>3. Qualifications. The minimum qualifications for certification as a school psychological service provider are as follows:</u>
  - A. For certification as an associate school psychologist, an individual must meet the credentialing standards established by the National Association of School Psychologists or be credentialed by a national school psychology certification system.
    - B. For certification as a school psychologist, an individual must meet the qualifications for certification as an associate school psychologist and must have received a doctorate degree reflecting comprehensive training in psychology from an accredited institution recognized by the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists in accordance with section 3831, subsection 2.
- 4. Scope of practice. The services provided by a school 2.2 psychologist or associate school psychologist may be applied only within the confines of a school district in activities related . 24 directly to the education of its students pursuant to a contract between the school psychological service provider, the school 26 district, union or educational facility and within guidelines for 28 such practices as developed by the National Association of School Psychologists and the Department of Education. This practice may 30 involve the evaluation and assessment and the provision of direct services to pupils and their families consistent with the pupils' 32 educational status or needs. The practice may include consultation with representatives of school districts, teachers, 34 special education staff, consultants and administrators.
  - 5. Rules. The Department of Education shall, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, adopt rules for the proper administration of this section. These rules must be developed with the input and advice of the Joint Committee on Certification for School Psychological Service Providers.
- 6. Existing school psychologists and psychological examiners. Any person who is certified by the Department of Education as a school psychologist on the effective date of this section is considered to have met the requirements set forth in this section for certification as a school psychologist. Any person who is certified by the Department of Education as a school psychological examiner on the effective date of this section is considered to have met the requirements set forth in this section for certification as an associate school psychologist.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the availability and improve the quality, of school psychological services by adopting widely accepted national standards for certification of school psychological service providers and by making Maine's certification process more consistent with prevailing practices in other states. Maine is currently one of only 2 states that requires school psychological service providers to be licensed by the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists in addition to being certified by the Department of Education. replaces the current joint licensure-certification process for school psychological service providers with a certification process that is under the sole authority of the Department of Education.

The bill exempts school psychological service providers who are certified by the Department of Education from the requirement that they also be licensed by the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists.

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The bill changes the name of the Joint Committee on Licensure-Certification for School Psychological Service Providers to the Joint Committee on Certification for School Psychological Service Providers. The purpose and duties of the committee and its membership are also revised to complement the new certification process.

The bill establishes a certification process within the Education for Department of school psychological providers. The 2 levels of certification are school psychologist and associate school psychologist. The bill adopts the standards established by the National Association of School Psychologists as the minimum standard for certification as an associate school To be certified as a school psychologist, psychologist. required in addition to the National doctorate degree is Association of School Psychologists requirements. Individuals who are currently certified as school psychologist and school psychological examiners under the joint licensure-certification considered to have met the requirements are certification school psychologist and associate school as psychologists respectively.

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
