Each nuclear power plant licensee operations are monitored under this chapter shall pay a fee to State Nuclear Safety Inspector to the permanent fund 26 established in section 680, subsection 7. The fee shall must 28 take the form of a yearly payment indicated in this subsection for the fiscal year from the fund established in section 680, 30 subsection 7, for the full cost of the on-site inspection program, including the cost to the State for personnel and fringe 32 benefits. 34 The State Nuclear Safety Inspector fee shall-be-\$80,000-annually is \$350,000 for fiscal year 1991-92 and \$100,000 per year in 36 subsequent fiscal years.
