An Act to Expedite Repairs of Equipment Needed by Supplemental Security Income Recipients.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §3174-K is enacted to read:

<u>§3174-K. Repair of equipment</u>

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1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

12A. "Equipment" means any piece of equipment that may be
purchased, leased or repaired with Medicaid funds and that14is needed by a person with a disability. "Equipment"
includes, but is not limited to, wheelchairs and hearing16aids.

B. "Extraordinary expense" means a repair charge that is significantly higher than the usual and customary charge for that repair.

 22 2. Prior approval may not be required. The department may not require recipients of federal supplemental security income
24 benefits to obtain prior approval for Medicaid reimbursement of repairs to equipment if the repairs are needed for proper
26 functioning of the equipment and if the repairs are expected to be completed without extraordinary expense.

STATEMENT OF FACT

 32 Presently, prior approval is required for any Medicaid-funded repair of equipment that costs more than \$100.
34 The bill eliminates this prior approval requirement for recipients of federal supplemental security income benefits.

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
