An Act to Ensure Early Intervention Services to Eligible Special Needs Children from Birth to Age 5.

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52	Act, the Interdepartmental Coordinating Committee for Preschool Handicapped Children shall adopt rules

governing eligibility criteria and definition of covered services for handicapped children from birth to age 5 that provide a range of services to the larger age group targeted by this Act so that services are provided to handicapped children from birth to age 5 at the same total cost as projected under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 7711 before amendment by this Act.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill expands the eligibility for special education services for preschool children. Special education services now 12 available to preschool handicapped children from 3 to 5 years of 14age will be made available to preschool handicapped children from birth to 5 years of age. In implementing this bill, the 16 Interdepartmental Coordinating Committee for Preschool Handicapped Children is directed to define eligibility and the 18 array of services provided so that the total cost is the same as before the expansion of the targeted age group.
