This amendment replaces the original bill. The original

bill requires the Department of Human Services to have a regular presence in each county. The amendment repeals a resolve regarding services in Belfast in order to give the department greater flexibility in allocating its regional resources. The Legislature's intent is that the department use the flexibility to provide intake services in each county in the most cost-effective manner.
