Upon application by a landowner, the commissioner shall award financial compensation equivalent to the loss in property value attributable to the restrictions imposed under section 480-C in coastal and freshwater wetlands. The amount of compensation may not exceed the difference between the value of the property in the absence of regulation under this article, as determined by the commissioner, and the current assessed value of the property. The determination of the commissioner constitutes final agency action under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.

The bill provides a mechanism to compensate landowners for the property value losses incurred as a result of regulation under the wetlands portion of the natural resource protection An appeal from the decision of the Commissioner of Environmental Protection may be taken under Administrative Procedure Act.
