39 MRSA §55-B, first and 2nd ¶¶, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
4 559, Pt. B, §30, are amended to read:

§55-B. Compensation for partial incapacity

While the incapacity for work resulting from the injury is partial, the employer shall pay the injured employee a weekly compensation equal to 2/3 the difference, due to the injury, between his the employee's average gross weekly wages, earning earnings or salary before the injury and the weekly wages, earnings or salary which—he that the employee is able to earn after the injury, but not more than the maximum benefit under section 53-B. Payments under this section shall may not continue for longer than 400 1,000 weeks after maximum medical improvement.

This section applies only to employees injured on or after the-effective-date-of-this-section November 20, 1987.
