26	7. Contributions to committee. The names and mailing addresses of contributors who donate in excess of \$50 each year
28	to the committee with amount or value of each contribution at the time of registration, except that a political action committee
30	organized outside this State is required to report a donation
32	from a contributor outside this State only if the contributor donated in excess of \$100. Any person who makes contributions on
34	an installment basis, the total of which exceeds \$50 in the calendar year, is considered a contributor to be identified under
36 ·	this subsection.

40	6. Identification of contributions. Names and mailing addresses of contributors who have given more than \$50 to the

The following funds are appropriated 2 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act. 1991-92 1992-93 4 **COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENTAL** 6 ETHICS AND ELECTION PRACTICES 8 **Commission on Governmental Ethics** and Election Practices 10 All Other \$500 \$525 12 Provides funds for printing 14 and mailing costs. 16 **FISCAL NOTE** · 18 1991-92 1992-93 20 22 **APPROPRIATIONS/ALLOCATIONS** 24 General Fund \$500 \$525 This bill provides General Fund appropriations to the 26 Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices in the amount of \$500 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$525 in fiscal year 28 1992-93 for printing and mailing costs. 30 The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices 32 can absorb the tasks associated with implementing the provisions of this bill if current staffing levels are not decreased. The Governor's current services budget proposal for the commission 34 recommends reducing a full-time position to part-time, which will impact upon the commission's ability to fulfill these tasks. 36 This bill individually does not warrant providing an additional 38 appropriation for staff support. The required General Fund appropriation will depend on the cumulative effect of all legislation affecting the Commission on Governmental Ethics and 40 Election Practices.' 42 STATEMENT OF FACT 44 This amendment exempts political action committees organized 46 outside Maine from the contribution reporting requirement for 48 contributions of \$100 or less made by contributors outside Maine.

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
