SENATE AMENDMENT "^G" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 14 653, L.D. 927, Bill, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General 16 Fund and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending 18 June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993"

Amend the amendment in Part II by striking out all of section II-1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. II-1. Review, report and limitations on administrative costs in 24 contract agencies. The Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and the Department of Human Services shall review the administrative expenses of agencies with which they contract for 26 the provision of client services; recommend a standard definition of administrative expenses; and recommend a maximum level of 28 administrative expenses that it would be appropriate for the 30 State to fund. The departments shall submit the results of the review and their recommendations for legislation and rules to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and the Joint 32 Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs by 34 January 1, 1992. In developing a definition of allowable administrative expenses, the departments shall consider the 36 purpose of the contracts and costs such as dues and memberships, travel, advertising, legal and lobbying fees, consultants, donations, subscriptions, bonuses and incentives, purchase, 38 rental or lease of vehicles and salaries attributable to 40 administrative functions.

With respect to all contracts signed after July 1, 1991, the departments shall provide that administrative costs associated with the contract may not exceed the percentage that administrative costs of the agency were of total agency costs in fiscal year 1988-89 applied to the total amount of the contract being funded.'

Further amend the amendment in Part II in section II-2 in the 4th and 5th lines (page 416, lines 16 and 17 in amendment) by striking out the following: "of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1659" and inserting in its place the following: 'established in section II-1 of this Part'

Further amend the amendment in Part II in section II-4 in that part designated "FINANCE, DEPARTMENT OF" under the caption "Executive Branch Departments and Independent Agencies -Statewide" in the 9th to 11th lines (page 416, lines 48 and 49 and page 417, line 1 in amendment) by striking out the following: "the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1659," and inserting in its place the following: 'section II-1 of this Part,'

16 Further amend the amendment in Part II in section II-4 in that part designated "HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF" under the caption "Purchased Social Services" in the 8th to 10th lines (page 417, lines 31 to 33 in amendment) by striking out the 20 following: "the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1659," and inserting in its place the following: 'section II-1 of this 22 Part,'

Further amend the amendment in Part II in section II-4 in 24 designated "MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL that part 26 OF" RETARDATION, DEPARTMENT under the caption "Departmentwide" in the 8th to 10th lines (page 418, lines 1 to 3 in amendment) by striking out the following: "the Maine 28 Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1659," and inserting in its 30 place the following: 'section II-1 of this Part,'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment directs the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and the Department of Human Services to develop a definition of allowable administrative expenses by rule and to report to the Legislature rather than placing a list of disallowed expenses in the statutes. The amendment also requires the departments to ensure that administrative costs are not more than the percentage of administrative costs in the preceeding fiscal year.
