shortfall, including Medicaid's share of bad debt and charity care,-but-no-mere-than-1/2-the-amount-appropriated-for-services 2 and-administration-of-the-Maine-Health-Program-created-in-section For the state fiscal year 1990-91, the appropriation 4 includes 1/2 of the amount of the state share for the operation of a demonstration project, if approved and received by the department from the federal Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to the federal Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1989, Public Law 101-239, Section 6407. For the purposes 10 of this section, the amount of the Medicaid shortfall for the biennium beginning July 1, 1989, is deemed to be \$15,000,000 12 annually.

There will be no net fiscal impact to the General Fund. The amount of funds being deappropriated from the Maine Health Program are appropriated to the Department of Education for general purpose aid to local schools.

There will be a reduction in federal funds in the amount of \$695,000 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$795,000 in fiscal year 1992-93.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment repeals the Maine Health Program. The savings from that repeal are earmarked for General Purpose Aid for Education.
