(EMERGENCY)

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	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

	Whereas, county jails are a major component of the State's
6	correctional system; and
8	Whereas, the expense of operating county jails is financed
10	by municipalities within the county through the property tax with little or no control over the budget for jail operation; and
12	Whereas, it is necessary to immediately begin to alter the funding mechanism for county jails to more broadly based revenue
14	sources at the state level as a means of providing local property tax relief; and

18	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	1. County jails. The responsibility for funding county
30	jails shifts to the State according to the following timetable.
32	A. Beginning on July 1, 1991, the State shall pay 10% of
	the costs associated with the county jail system, including,
34	but not limited to, the costs for personnel, operation,
	maintenance, construction and debt service.

	B. Beginning on July 1, 1992, the State shall pay 20% of
38	the costs associated with the county jail system, including,
	but not limited to, the costs for personnel, operation,
40	maintenance, construction and debt service.
42	C. Beginning on July 1, 1993, the State shall pay 30% of
	the costs associated with the county jail system, including,
44	but not limited to, the costs for personnel, operation,
	maintenance, construction and debt service.

	the costs associated with the county jail system, including,

	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
32	preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

	This bill increases the State's share of funding county
38	jails over a 10-year period leading up to a total assumption of
	the cost of the county jails beginning on July 1, 2000.
