COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{A} " to H.P. 658, L.D. 937, Bill, "An Act to Encourage Recycling of Waste Oil"

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Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 2, 3 and 4 and inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §1099-B, sub-§§1 and 4, as enacted by PL 1989,
c. 774, §4, are amended to read:

22 1. Program established. There is established the Waste Oil Furnace Loan Program to be administered by the authority through approved lenders. The program subsidizes interest costs of loans 24 made to eligible businesses entities purchasing and properly 26 installing qualified waste oil boilers and furnaces. The program subsidizes loan interest rates made by approved lenders to 28 achieve an effective interest rate to borrowers of 3%. Loan amounts are limited to the purchase price of the boiler or 30 furnace but may not exceed \$5,000 for any boiler or furnace. The term of loans made under this subchapter may not exceed 5 years. 32

4. Entities. Businesses Entities participating in the
34 program are responsible for repayment of the principal borrowed
38 interest, subject to conditions established by the
36 authority and the lenders. As a condition of the loan,
businesses entities must:

A. Properly install the boiler or furnace and consent to post-installation inspection procedures established by the authority; and

 B. Agree to burn only self-generated waste oil or waste oil
44 that has the characteristics of specification waste oil as defined by rule of the Department of Environmental
46 Protection.'

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

4 **'FISCAL NOTE** 6 This bill makes municipalities eligible for low interest loans from available balances in the Waste Oil Furnace Loan 8 Program. Any administrative costs to the Finance Authority of Maine can be absorbed within existing resources.' 10 12 STATEMENT OF FACT 14 original bill made municipalities eligible 16 The for interest-free loans through the Waste Oil Furnace Loan Program established by Public Law 1989, chapter 774 and administered by 18 the Finance Authority of Maine. The amendment retains the bill's municipal eligibility provisions, but establishes the loan 20 interest rate at 3%, the same rate currently available to eligible businesses. The amendment also strikes a provision in 22 the bill requiring the Maine Waste Management Agency to provide technical and financial support to municipalities for the 24 collection, recycling and disposal of waste oil.
