An Act to Support an Affordable Emergency Medical Services System.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, emergency medical services, or EMS, are recognized to be effective in saving the lives of hundreds of citizens and visitors annually who would have otherwise died from their injuries or acute illness; and

10 Whereas, EMS are recognized to be effective in improving the quality of life of thousands of citizens and visitors annually 12 who would have otherwise suffered greater incapacitation as a result of their injuries or acute illness; and

Whereas, those citizens whose lives have been preserved by EMS are estimated to generate more than \$165,000,000 of income and contribute more than \$2,000,000 in state income tax annually to the General Fund; and

20 Whereas, EMS volunteers are estimated to contribute over
\$20,000,000 in service annually which would otherwise require
22 tax-base or patient-charge subsidy; and

24 Whereas, it is vital to the citizens to have a coordinated EMS system, to encourage EMS training and to support 26 volunteerism; and

28 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 30 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 32 safety; now, therefore,

34 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36 Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
