Resolve, to Allow Scott Keirstead and Don Keirstead, Who Are a Partnership Farming Operation Located in Presque Isle, Known as Keirstead Farm, to Bring a Civil Action against the State.

This action may be brought in the Aroostook County Superior Court within one year from the date this resolve is approved. Liability and damages, including punitive damages, must be determined according to state law as in litigation between individuals. The action may be heard by a Justice of the Superior Court or by a jury. The Maine Rules of Civil Procedure govern the conduct of the action. The Attorney General shall appear, answer and defend the action.

The Treasurer of State shall pay any judgment, including costs and interest, on final process issued by the Superior Court or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve authorizes Scott Keirstead and Don Keirstead to sue the State for damages resulting from alleged negligence by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources in the process of inspecting and analyzing potatoes.
