26	'Sec. 1. Task force established. The Lobster Management Task Force is established.
28	Sec. 2. Members; chairs. The Lobster Management Task Force
30	consists of the 13 legislators who are members of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources. The task force is
3 2	chaired jointly by the House and Senate chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources.
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36	Sec. 3. Meetings. The Lobster Management Task Force shall meet at the joint call of the chairs. The task force shall meet as often as necessary to complete the duties set forth in section
38	4. All meetings of the task force must be in coastal counties.
10	Sec. 4. Duties. The Lobster Management Task Force shall:

- Conduct a review of the types of participants in the Maine lobster fishing industry, including harvesters and dealers;
- Review the economic structure of and conditions in the lobster fishery;
- 3. Review the biological status of the lobster fishery;

Review the issues of competition, lobster trap limits, gear conflicts, trawl limits and limited entry restrictions; and Consider the feasibility of creating coastal zones for lobster fisheries management. Sec. 5. Report. The task force shall report its findings together with any recommended legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1992. 10 Sec. 6. Staffing. 12 The Department of Marine Resources shall provide contractual services, staffing and clerical support to the Lobster Management Task Force. 14 Sec. 7. Compensation. This bill creates a 13-member Lobster Management Task Force, which will require General Fund appropriations to the Department of Marine Resources of \$40,612 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$17,394 in fiscal year 1992-93 for a Project Clerk II position, contractual services and compensation for the members of the task force. Funding for the task force is also included in a companion bill, L.D. 1673 "An Act to Increase Fees for Licenses Issued by the Department of Marine Resources." If L.D. 1673 is enacted, then the net General Fund cost of this bill could be eliminated.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

16 This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment creates a 13-member Lobster Management Task Force to study issues pertaining to the health and sustainability of the lobster 18 fishery and various lobster fishery management tools such as 20 limited entry and lobster trap limits. The task force is composed of all members of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine The task force is required to report to the Second 22 Resources. Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by November 1, 1992. 24 Members of the task force are entitled to receive legislative per diem and expenses for task force meetings from funds appropriated 26 to the Department of Marine Resources for those purposes.
