An Act to Amend the Provisions of the Maine State Retirement System Laws Relating to Benefits of Inactive Members Who Retire after Normal Retirement Age.

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Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17804, first ¶, as amended by PL 1989, c. 95, §9, is further amended to read:

Except as provided in subsection 6, payment of a service retirement benefit shall must begin on the first day of the month following the month in which the qualifying member becomes eligible to receive payment of the member's service retirement benefit under section 17851 or 17907. A full month's benefit shall must be paid to the beneficiary or estate of the recipient for the month in which the member dies. -A- Except as provided in subsections 6 and 7, a qualifying member may select payment in one of the following methods.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17804, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Retirement after normal retirement age. If the application for service retirement benefits from a member who qualifies for a service retirement benefit under section 17851, subsection 2, is received by the retirement system more than one year after the member reaches normal retirement age, payment of the member's benefits must be under subsection 1.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA \$18404, first ¶, as amended by PL 1989, c. 95, \$16, is further amended to read:

Except as provided in subsection 6, payment of a service retirement benefit shall must begin on the first day of the month following the month in which the qualifying member becomes eligible to receive payment of the member's service retirement benefit under section 18451 or 18507. A full month's benefit shall must be paid to the beneficiary or estate of the recipient for the month in which the member dies. -A- Except as provided in subsections 6 and 7, a qualifying member may select payments in one of the following methods.

Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §18404, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Retirement after normal retirement age. If the application for service retirement benefits from a member who qualifies for a service retirement benefit under section 18451, subsection 2, is received by the retirement system more than one year after the member reaches normal retirement age, payment of the member's benefits must be under subsection 1.

Sec. 5. Implementation. Before the effective date of this Act, the Maine State Retirement System shall notify by certified mail, at their last known addresses, all inactive members over normal retirement age who are eligible to retire under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17851, subsection 2 or section 18451, subsection 2, that if they do not file applications before

	This bill amends the provisions of the laws governing the
10	Maine State Retirement System relating to benefits of inactive members who retire after reaching normal retirement age. Current
12	practice allows an inactive member to postpone retirement for a number of years and then select the most favorable option
14	retroactively.
16	This bill limits payment of benefits to full benefits, which are monthly payments for the retiree's lifetime with no further
18	payments after the retiree's death, if the application for service retirement benefits is received by the retirement system
20	more than one year following the attainment of normal retirement age.

	The bill also requires that, before January 1, 1992, the
24	Maine State Retirement System notify each inactive vested member who is over normal retirement age before that date that if the
26	member does not file an application for retirement benefits
	before January 1, 1993, the method in which the benefits will be

paid will be limited to full benefits.

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
