Resolve, to Establish the State Comprehensive Energy Plan Commission.



Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the State Comprehensive Energy Plan Commission is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 15 members: 3 Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom must be a member of the minority party; 3 members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom must be a member of the minority party; the Director of the State Planning Office; the Chair of the Public Utilities Commission; the Public Advocate; the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development; and the Commissioner of Environmental Protection. Additional members, to be appointed by the Governor, include one member representing an environmental organization, member representing а utility company, one representing a nonutility electric generator and one representing a nongenerator business interest. The Director of the State Planning Office shall serve as chair of the commission; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Appointments: meetings. Resolved: all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the, Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. The Director of the State Planning Office shall call the first meeting of the commission; and be it further

An examination of the existing transmission capacities within this State and the rest of New England, including availability, pricing, accessibility and reliability. This examination should identify transmission bottlenecks and suggest strategies and policies to address them; and
