Resolve, to Permit Certain Uses of the State Seal.

(EMERGENCY)

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	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the state seal may not now be used or displayed for
6	commercial purposes without express permission from the Governor; and
8	Whereas, it is currently unclear what guidelines or criteria
10	for approval are applied; and
12	Whereas, this requirement discourages numerous potential uses of the State seal that are both educational and honorable;

16	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
18	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
20	safety; now, therefore, be it
22	Sec. 1. Development of guidelines. Resolved: That the Office of the Secretary of State shall review the current approved uses of
24	the state seal and develop guidelines for the review and approval of future requests to use the state seal for commercial purposes;
26	and be it further
28	Sec. 2. Presentation of findings. Resolved: That the Office of the Secretary of State shall present its findings and any
30	necessary implementing legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1991.
32	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
34	preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
