38	6. The Legislative Council may seek outside sources of funding to finance the activities of the commission. The

26	This bill creates the Primary Care Residency Commission and requires an allocation of Other Special Revenue funds to the
28	Legislature of \$15,000 in fiscal year 1991-92 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members, printing and contractual
	services. The commission will not incur expenses until outside
30	sources of funding have been received by the Legislative Council.'
32	
34	STATEMENT OF FACT
36	This amendment eliminates an appropriation for the Maine Primary Care Residency Training Assistance Program and clarifies
38	that the Finance Authority of Maine is required to establish that program only if funds are available.
10	
12	The amendment also establishes the Primary Care Residency Commission to develop funding mechanisms for the primary care
14	residency program. The commission is authorized to seek outside funds for its activities but may not incur any General Fund
# *	expenditures. The amendment also adds an emergency preamble, an
16	allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
