COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "

to H.P. 696, L.D. 1000

FISCAL NOTE

This bill allows the State to purchase Fort Gorges from the City of Portland for \$1 and allows the State the right to assign its right of first refusal to certain nonprofit groups. If the State purchases Fort Gorges, there may be future costs to the Department of Conservation, Bureau of Parks and Recreation for administration and operations. The amount of these costs can not be determined at this time.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

14 This amendment grants the State the power to assign its right of first refusal to a Maine nonprofit historical or Maine nonprofit environmental group if a bona fide purchase offer for 16 Fort Gorges is received by the City of Portland. The responsibility to continue public access to Fort Gorges as a 18 public historical monument is required by the deed. The 20 amendment also sets the sale price at \$1 and adds a fiscal note . . to the bill. 22
